Last year, we published our first ever sustainability report with our goals for 2019 and beyond. We are happy to report that we have successfully been able to collect more recyclable materials from the stream, as well as exceed our goals for residential household recyclables. Today, we recycle materials for over 880,000 residents throughout Monmouth and Atlantic County, and we only plan on increasing our reach with other Material Recovery Facilities throughout the nation.

With the addition of our brand new, state-ofthe-art 70,000 square foot Material Recovery Facility in Tinton Falls, we hope to continually improve the recycling rates in New Jersey. We have already begun to identify the ways in which we can make an even more positive impact in 2021. With our strong team of frontline workers and dedicated leaders, we are confident that we will continue to grow no matter what challenges come our way.

Thank you to our team of employees who have proved that sustainability will always be a priority at Mazza Recycling. We look forward to seeing what the future holds.

2020 Highlights

GRAND OPENING OF OUR SINGLE STREAM MATERIAL RECOVERY FACILITY (MRF)

Mazza Recycling held a Grand Opening ceremony of its single stream recycling facility in September. Guests included State Senator Vin Gopal, Assemblywoman Serena DiMaso, Assemblyman Eric Houghtaling, members of the Board of Chosen Commissioners, and special guest Monmouth County Commissioner Director Tom Arnone, all to show their support of Mazza's effort to increase recycling across the region.

OUR BRAND NEW MRF RECEIVES A GRANT TO BOOST PP RECOVERY

In December 2020, Mazza Recycling received a \$250,000 grant to aid in the recovery of polypropylene, or number 5 plastics from the Recycling Partnership. The grant went towards the latest polypropylene recycling recovery, as well as program resources to support our efforts in further educating the public on plastic recycling.

OUR MRF PROCESSES ATLANTIC COUNTY'S SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING

Mazza Recycling now processes all single stream recyclables from Atlantic County, NJ, recycling over 36,000 tons per year for over 260,000 New Jersey residents.

MAZZA RECYCLING FURTHERS THEIR MISSION IN MATERIAL RECOVERY

Our mission is to provide exceptional waste collection, recycling, and disposal services in a cost effective, safe manner while protecting and improving the environment in the communities we serve. With the completion of our 70,000 square foot single stream recycling facility, we are doing just that.

Our positive sorting system is designed to recycle 24 tons of material per hour. As one of the first of its kind on the east coast, we are able to efficiently recycle glass; cardboard; mixed paper; aluminum and tin cans; and plastics numbered 1, 2, and 5. The system uses sizing

screens and optical scanners to identify and separate these single-stream materials based on their size and color.

The new facility has afforded us to hire 50 new employees and provide over 100 new construction jobs during the pandemic, where unemployment rates were at an all time high in New Jersey. Our facility is on target to recycle over 100,000 tons in its first year.






2020 Recycling

A YEAR IN REVIEW...

Fortunately, in the state of New Jersey, there were little to no disruptions to waste and recycling collection in 2020. The biggest impact we noticed in our services was on commercial business and construction sites. Due to shutdowns and executive orders pausing non-essential construction and in-person dining, we saw a slight decrease in bulky waste and C&D waste. The recycling industry noticed an upward trend in residential recycling, however, due to residents responding to stay-at-home orders.

Renewable Energy

We generated 300,600 kilowatt-hours of renewable energy at our facilities from solar arrays, which is enough power to meet the annual electricity demand of nearly 36 households.

500,000 tons

We processed 500,000 tons of recyclable materials, marketing more than 50 different commodities including scrap metal, aggregates, organics, bulky and C&D waste, and residential & commercial paper, glass, and plastics.

Our 2020 recycling services saved the following amounts of energy which translates to each of the following (*per EPA WARM):

262,871 Barrels of oil not consumed

We maintained 47 acres of natural space at our facilities, including species habitat and forest, and wetlands.

We accepted 745,700 cubic yards of organic material to produce ten varieties of nutrient rich compost and mulch, including IPEMA Certified Playground Safety Surface and Natural Organic Hardwood Mulch.

Mazza Recycling provides comprehensive recycling education and outreach to our local communities, with the goal of teaching current and future generations the importance of recycling. We do this by providing programs designed to encourage sustainability in the form of tours, community tabling & events, and in-school presentations. The program is custom tailored to best serve the needs of our local residents, customers, schools, educators, and other organizations.

VIRTUAL PRESENTATIONS

Due to COVID-19 and the unfortunate cancellation of our 2020 recycling presentations, we had to improvise. We were lucky to be able to provide virtual presentations for Earth Day, as well as virtual tours of our brand new single stream recycling facility. Virtual tours are facilitated by an educated member of Mazza's team and custom made so that students and adults of all ages can learn about complex recycling systems in a fun and engaging way.



TABLING & EVENTS

Mazza Recycling is an active participant in community events — including festivals, parades, fairs, and Earth Month celebrations. At these events, our team engages the public, often answering questions about proper disposal of specific materials, such as recyclables or bulky items. Our teams come prepared with interactive sorting games and eco-friendly giveaways that promote recycling and waste reduction.



TOURS

Mazza Recycling welcomes groups to tour many of our facilities, including our recycling and organics processing operation, transfer station, and single stream recycling facility to provide an inside look at recovery and sorting operations. Our team regularly hosts tours for school groups and commercial businesses, community groups, product designers, and industry professionals interested in learning about how their actions impact the recycling process.

Mazza Recycling also always maintains a strict environmental program to ensure a clean footprint for future generations.

TRUCK SAFETY


Vehicle safety is an important topic here at Mazza Recycling. Every vehicle on the road receives a thorough inspection prior to being used, utilizing an app that guides each employee through the proper steps to complete a world-class inspection. Front-facing cameras have been implemented to ensure that safe driving habits are developed. Our truck fleet has driven over 275,000 miles collectively in the past year with no serious accidents or injuries. For a second year in a row, our drivers have proven that they have a high level of safe driving with a 97% compliance score.



EMPLOYEE SAFETY

Individual employee safety is a top priority at all times. This is shown by the year-after-year trend of lowered rates of injury. Mazza recycling utilizes state-of-the-art training methods and materials to ensure the understanding of all policies and procedures in three different languages. These trainings include online and in-person training.
